Girls Circle is continuing to grow! Serving Sussex Tech, Cape Henlopen, Milford, Seaford and Polytech, we are encouraging 45 young ladies to practice self-care, self-love, and knowing exactly what they want. Through discussions, journaling and reflection, they are able to be vulnerable in a space that was curated just for them. Recent sessions have been about the importance of knowing their personal standards for themselves and practicing safe sex. We have also discussed the importance of sticking to their standards and how they would react when faced with difficult situations, such as someone pressuring them to do something they do not want to do. The girls have expressed their appreciation for these topics and how our discussions have made them think about things they normally would not have! Every other week the young ladies can't wait to get back to Girls Circle. They have even requested that we get-together over the summer!


Pathways to Fair Housing




AVA CANNON
